Declaration of Quorum

Correspondence

The Synod **VOTED** to accept the resignation of Commissioned Ruling Elder Sandra Wagenius as Moderator of the Synod's Committee on Representation as requested in her letter of March 19, 2012.

New Business

In the matter of revisions to the Corporation Bylaws, former Stated Clerk Richard E. Melin had reported to the Presbyter to Synod and the Acting Stated Clerk that the Synod had somehow missed final approval in 2011 of some revisions proposed to make them consistent with the new synod organization, structure and staffing. However, after further review, Acting Stated Clerk Muriel C. Brown reported that the amended revisions had in fact been approved at the Synod meeting on March 31, 2011. Since that time, a new Form of Government has been adopted by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) thus necessitating further review of synod documents to be certain that language and other provisions are consistent with the new Form of Government. The Acting Stated Clerk will undertake that review and bring any recommended changes to the May synod Mid-Council meeting.

Ruling Elder Sarah Beard, Moderator, presented the report of the Finance Committee, recommending some beneficial account consolidations.

The Synod **VOTED** to approve transferring the \$5,292.87 in accounts 2200-13 and 2200-14 to account 2200-18 (CMHE) and then retiring accounts 2200-13 and 2200-14. Research on these accounts implied an intended use for higher education purposes.

The Synod **VOTED** to approve transferring the \$68.18 in account 2200-16 (Higher Education-Interns) to account 2200-18 (CMHE) and then retiring account 2200-16.

The Synod **VOTED** to approve transferring the \$6,717.80 in account 2200-22 (Staff Continuing Education) to Unrestricted Reserve account 2400-40 and then retiring account 2200-22. These funds were unused continuing education funds set aside over the years for previous staff members no longer employed by the Synod.

In response to the assignment from the March 13, 2012 Mid-Council meeting, the Finance Committee presented a list of assets, showing as completely as possible the origin and purpose of each. **APPENDIX A**

In response to an inquiry/request from the Rev. Terry McGonigal, Whitworth chaplain and director of the Whitworth Institute of Ministry, the Synod **VOTED** to make available from unrestricted reserves \$10,000 for scholarships for families from the synod to attend the Whitworth Institute of Ministry this summer.

Moderator Leisa Carrick raised the issue of how requests for funding (like the WIM request) that don't go through the Grants Task Force come before the Synod. Do we need to put some process in place? The Finance Committee was asked to let the synod assembly know how much money might be available on a yearly basis for a "spending pool" for responding to such requests. The Grants Task Force was asked to bring a recommendation on possible criteria and ideas on how a request would move to the Mid-Council meeting for action.

The need to have our buildings appraised was noted. We need to identify possible appraisers and get quotes. The Rev. Joyce Emery, with help from Ruling Elder Sarah Beard, will seek an appraiser for the Synod office building in Seattle. The Rev. Sheryl Kinder-Pyle will find someone in the Pullman area for the campus ministry building Interfaith House.

A comprehensive overview of the ministries and covenant partnerships of the Synod was included in the portfolio for the meeting. **APPENDIX B** After a bit of clean-up of the copy and development of a few questions (by the Rev. Joyce Emery and the Rev. Dick Erickson) it will be ready to send out to the presbytery councils for consideration at their next meeting and for their response and feedback by September 30, 2012 as to which ministries/partnerships they would be interested in undertaking. Synod Commissioners are expected to interpret the document and be involved in the discussion at their own presbytery council.

Attention was called to the draft position description for the Stated Clerk. The Personnel Committee will be meeting on April 11 to finalize the position description. The Nominating Committee is working on a slate of nominees to serve on a Stated Clerk Nominating Committee. This committee will be elected at the May 8 Mid-Council meeting.

Commissioners were reminded of the farewell luncheon on April 17 for Rick Melin. Notes of appreciation for his years of service as Synod Stated Clerk can be sent on-line through the Synod's website.

The next Mid-Council meeting will be at 4:00 p.m. on May 8, 2012, by telephone conference call.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:40 p.m. Pacific Daylight Time. The Vice-Moderator Rev. Eric Chavis offered the closing prayer.

APPENDIX A

ASSET ACCOUNTS: ORIGINS AND PURPOSES

Asset accounts in the 2200-00 Restricted – Budgeted Funds

2200-10 Leadership Development - \$501.68 – For leadership initiatives like Whitworth Institute of Ministry and sabbatical grants.

2200-11 BOP Spiritual Leadership - \$19,508.28 – From BOP grant for use by Seattle, NPS and Olympia Presbyteries only.

2200-12 Housing Ministry Fund - \$2,507.46 – From manse expenses for pastors' housing. FC will move this account to the 2200-50 series.

Research implies use for higher education purposes for the following two accounts (2200-13 and 2200-14). **For these FC recommends transferring \$5,292.87 to account 2200-18 (CMHE) then retiring these two accounts.**

2200-13 Racial & Ethnic Development - \$335.19 History unknown and unknowable.

2200-14 Self-Development of People - \$4,957.68 This was a pass-thru account – no recent use.

2200-15 NACC Leadership Development - \$0 ***Retire this unused account***

2200-16 Higher Education-Interns - \$68.18 Was for pastoral intern program at colleges. **FC recommends transferring \$68.18 to 2200-18 then retiring this account.**

2200-17 GA Heiserman Fund - \$32,000

2200-18 C.M.H.E. - \$50,230.20 Based on audit reports, these funds left over from Westminster Foundation activity on behalf of higher education programs. FC recommends retaining with balances from #s 13, 14, 16.

2200-19 Palestinian Mission to Synod - \$0 ***Retire this unused account***

2200-20 Earth Keepers - \$0 ***Retire this unused account***

2200-21 Communication - \$7,070.26 From GA grants. FC recommends moving \$ to 2200-50 series (Grants Task Force).

2200-22 Staff Continuing Education - \$6,717.80 – represents accrual of unused continuing education funds set aside by previous staff members over the years. **Recommend transfer of \$6,717.80 to Unrestricted Reserve 2400-40 and *Retire this account***

2200-23 NMPF Grants - \$12,720.82 – Funds given to Synod by General Assembly to help raise unified mission giving at the presbytery and congregational levels.

2200-24 Higher Education – Shalom - \$2,817.64 - Funds are for ecumenical campus ministries and most likely left over from Synod’s Westminster Foundation.

2200-30 INW Loan Interest - \$25,948.08 - Funds from INW Loan Interest – and have been unrestricted.

Accounts in the 2200-50 series are within the Restricted Donor group, and will be addressed in the near future by verifying designations, and recommending work on changing any designations that are found to be obsolete via contact with donor, or if that contact is not possible, FC recommending changes for MC action.

Accounts in the 2300-00 group: FC recommends changing the title of this group from “Board Designated Gain on Sale” to “Board Designated Real Estate Reserve”.

2300-20 UW Real Estate Sale \$301,110.45 - refers to sale of Covenant House, which was purchased using \$ from the sale of Westminster House (both on UW campus). This balance shows original sale amount and will be reflected differently on the balance sheet to account for the effect of the “Note receivable – UW” (account 1200-20) balance being reduced by payments received.

2300-30 WWU – Shalom Center \$114,814 Gained from sale of the Shalom Center in Bellingham.

2400-50 Emergency Grants \$59,103.59. Presbyterian to Synod Joyce Emery’s research indicates that these are no longer required by G.A. and don’t need a separate account.

COMPREHENSIVE OVERVIEW OF SYNOD MINISTRIES AND COVENANT PARTNERSHIPS

Re: Comprehensive Overview of Synod Ministries and Partnerships, 2012

Currently, presbyteries in the Synod of Alaska Northwest are voting on a reduced function proposal. If passed, the Synod will perform administrative overview, PJC oversight as required and budget preparation lead by 7 ruling elders and 7 teaching elders who will also be active members of the seven presbytery councils and by an elected Stated Clerk. Existing Synod ministries and partnerships will be referred to presbyteries in the hopes that a presbytery or a group of presbyteries will be taking on one or more of the ministries or covenant relationships. If no presbytery steps up, the ministry or partnership will cease. In the event “reduced function” does not pass, we still need to review the ministries of the Synod in order to move faithfully into the future. To assist in this process we are providing a list of existing ministry/partnerships together with a brief description of the ministry/partnership where needed, the names and email of contact persons, and the amount/source of funds allocated to them this past year, if any. **We are asking Presbytery Councils to officially respond to this list of existing ministries/partnerships by September 30, 2012.** Please make your response to the Stated Clerk of the Synod: stated.clerk@synodnw.org. Presbytery councils are asked to choose which ministries or partnerships they wish to support. Since the reduced function proposal includes an option to join with other presbyteries in support, presbyteries are asked to communicate among themselves to identify which ministries and partnerships are of mutual interest. The Synod staff is eager to answer any questions you might have as we proceed. Until the vote on the reduced function is complete this fall, we would ask that outside ministries not be contacted.

This document is intended to be opened at a computer when the user is connected to the internet. All of the links are live and will provide the reader the chance to learn more about each of the covenants and ministries named.

An Example:

1. Covenants.

Is your Presbytery called to pursue a covenant with any or all of these entities?

We assume that each Presbytery will decide. Where there is no interest the Synod leaders will move to end the covenant in a formal and dignified process. Presbytery councils are asked to identify who (Council, task force, individuals, etc.) will be responsible for coordinating the work on their behalf.
